## Worship Day Feedback

Sustainability for the Future

## Sustainability questionnaire feedback

- People welcomed getting together for the day more feedback on the day itself later
- Staying in Jewry Street is important to our community and Mission (79%\*of respondents rated this 4 or 5)
- Sustainability in caring for God's Creation is very important (82%\* rated this 5)
- Some people were willing & able to help fund the 'enabling' and 'energy' works (69%\* rated this 4 or 5), but some were not (31% rated this 2 or 3)
- Most people were willing to accommodate the disruption the building works require (89%\* rated this 4 or 5)
- People wanted much more time to discuss and consider these issues
- ……and there were some other themes in supporting comments

## Supporting Comments

There was concern over our ageing membership (this was probably the most frequent and consistent message), and the need to bring in new members, and change our style of worship

There was a belief that we need to clarify our purpose (described as a Vision) and our Mission prior to any decisions about our building

There were calls to modernise and make ourselves more relevant in helping the community with their priorities

There were suggestions of drawing others (including those from other faiths or none) from our community into any future dialogue about our future Mission and purpose of the building

There were (frequent and strong) concerns about the possible costs of energy building works, and a desire to explore 'creative' options to fund these

There were lots of practical suggestions of being 'greener' (that we should review)
